Subject: Snow Lake Water Control Structure Draft Environmental Assessment

Dear Interested Party:

The Bureau of Reclamation and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) have released for your review and comment a Draft Environmental Assessment (EA) for a water discharge control valve replacement project at Upper Snow Lake in Chelan County, Washington. The water control structure is on land owned by USFWS surrounded by the Alpine Lakes Wilderness Area. The proposed project would remove and replace the existing Upper Snow Lake tunnel water discharge control valve. The existing control valve has exceeded its expected 10 year service life and it cannot meet the 80 cubic feet per second (cfs) discharge capacity desired by the Icicle and Peshastin Irrigation Districts and Leavenworth National Fish Hatchery. This project would replace the outdated valve and install a new one that could meet the 80 cfs discharge capacity in order to provide cool, high quality water for fish in late summer.

Reclamation and USFWS are serving as co-lead agencies for this Draft EA under the National Environmental Policy Act. The Draft EA describes the proposed action and analyzes environmental consequences from the removal and replacement of the existing valve, including the means to transport materials, equipment, supplies and contract personnel to the remote location. Two actions are addressed in the Draft EA – a proposed action (with two alternatives) and no action. The proposed action is the removal and replacement of the water discharge control valve using helicopter support. Alternative 1 of the proposed action would authorize up to 30 helicopter flights and alternative 2 would authorize up to 15 helicopter flights.

Comments will be used to assess impacts on endangered species, historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects and the other public interest factors. Any comments received will be considered by Reclamation and the USFWS to determine potential alternatives and whether or not to carry out the proposed action. Comments will be used in the preparation of a final environmental assessment.
